Lyford spent years tracking down as many original source documents as possible. He visited where the ancestors lived, where they went to church, local hysterical societies, libraries, court houses, and and every other repository of state and local records he could find. He notes that spurious information plagues the internet these days, propagated by people who seem more interested in name collecting than accuracy. This is no Bah Hum Bug, merely a warning to take what you find on the web with a grain of salt unless original source documents are cited (Court or church records, wills, etc.) That goes for what is posted here, too.

Wishing to present records that are as accurate as possible, Lyford has made every effort to present facts, not guesses (Okay, a few guesses, but they are noted as such). And he does offer sources for much of what he posts. He acknowledges, however, that no one is perfect, must less him, so asks that you contact him at lyfordhale at gwandrw dot com should you take exception to something you find here.

While you are invited ... encouraged even ... to submit material and comments, such remarks as "You're crazy" or "You are an idiot" probably won't be received in the constructive manner you obviously intended.

One final note: These are Lyford's working pages and thus include many notes originally intended only for himself. You may, from time to time, find the exact same words on websites posted by otherresearchers. Rest assured they originated with Lyford.

#### GENEALOGY IN PRINT - BOOKS AND LIBRARY COLLECTIONS

From The Ancestors and Descendants of Jacob and Martha Harvey Hale, by Kathryn Williams: "The Heald colonists and the ancestors on the distaff lines came to America seeking religious freedom. Most of them were followers of George Fox. For this, as members of the Society of Friends (Quakers) in England and Ireland, they suffered oppression; had lands, goods and stock taken from them; and some endured imprisonment. This is a matter of public document. Only one ancestor on a distaff line is known to have been a land speculator but he had more than average means for the times. He left a monument by buying a whole township and naming it for himself, which name, time has not erased. The ancestors of Jacob Hale (Heald) were established in Cheshire, England, in the 17th century and were all 'of the people called Quakers.' Extracts from the Register for Cheshire and Staffordshire Quarterly Meetings in the Library, Friends House, London, England, note the burials of the Heald family in Mobberley Burial Ground, Pownall Fee, Cheshire. The known ancestors are herewith recorded."

From JV Hollingsworth Collection, Chester Co, PA, letter dated Apr 26, 1973, from Harry Hollingsworth:

"In the Cheshire Inquisitions post mortem, there is one for a William Healde, Mobberley, Gent., taken 17 James I. (1619-20) stating he died 14 April 1609, leaving his son and heir (not naming others, of course) George Healde, now aged 18 years, 5 weeks, 4 days, and Alice a widow, now in 1619-20, has married to Geoffrey Hill. I also find several Mobberley Healds in the Chester marriage licenses".

This William's death is about 10 years before others say our William married.

# MISC NOTES / QUESTIONS/ FOLLOWUP

The data for the first couple of Healds in this genealogy is suspect. Primary sources are hard to come by and on-line genealogies have numerous differences. Hobson is Robson, Ssteward is Stewart, Tthomas Heald is born when his father is 101 years old, some add an entire generation others don't have. A Pennsylvania book of births lists Samuel Heald born in PA in 1668, when most genealogists show the Pennsylvania Healds arrived in America in 1703. There is much to be done to clarify and debug the family history.

"I started playing with the 1881 Census & found very few Strettles in Cheshire. Most of the early ones seemed to originate in Lancs, in the Liverpool, Prescot & Garstang areas. Several were either Blacksmiths or Policemen which was intriguing. I then found one living in Allostock, Cheshire in 1664: Thomas Strettell was a servant to Gefferie Shakerley Esq. I was suitably amazed to find four in the Cheshire Remonstrance of 1642: Hughe Strettell of Mobberley, Thomas Strettel of Mobberley, Thomas Strettell of Knutsford and Raph Strettell of Dunham Massey. This, of course ruins my wonderful notion of how useful the 1881 Census is.

These Strettells are probably related to Alice, but I do not know how:

From "Immigration of the Irish Quakers into America," by Albert Cook Myers, pub 1902, Swarthmore, PA, page263 +:

Robert Strettell, Provincial Councillor and Mayor of Philadelphia, was born of Quaker parentage, 10 Mo 25, 1693, in Back Lane, Dublin.

His father, Amos Strettell, descended from a respectable Cheshire family, was born 12 Mo (Feb) 24, 1657, at Saltersley, in Mobberly, Cheshire, and removed to Dublin in 1 Mo (March) 1678-9, where he was married to Anne, daughter of Roger and Mary Roberts, of Dublin. ...

Amos Strettell made a purchase of 5,000 acres of land in Pennsylvania, but there is no evidence to show that he ever came to this country; he also held large tracts of land in New Jersey ... About 1716, Robert Strettell went to London and engaged in trade, but losing a large amount of money in the South Sea Bubble, he decided to remove to Pennsylvania. A certificate of removal, dated 11 Mo 26, 1736, for himself and family, from Friends' Meeting at Horslydowne, Southwark, was received by Philadelphia Monthly Meeting, 4 Mo. 24, 1737. ....

Cook cites "Keith's Provincial Councillors of Pennsylvania," 196-208; also entries from Strettell family Bible in Miscellanea Genealogica et Heraldica, III, 212, 2d Series, London, 1890, and Penn'a Mag., I, 241, II., 114-115." Cook writes that Amos Strettell's father was Hugh Strettell, son of Thomas Strettell (of Balkley, born 1598, died Aug. 1657) and his wife, Margaret Graffitt (of Alderley, married 1619). Hugh was born 1622, and was married to Mary Hulme, daughter of Francis Hulme. Hugh and Mary Strettell became members of the Society of Friends and resided at Saltersley, Cheshire; he died 7 Mo. 5, 1671 and she died 7 Mo. 11, 1662; buried in Friends' ground at Mobberly.

"It is reasonably certain from the English records that Thomas Heald and Elizabeth Hobson Heald of Mobberley, Cheshire, England, married 1641, belonged to the Society of Friends, that they had several children, the only one after the beginning of the Friends' records being James Heald, b 1658."

Also from Heald collection: transcribed list of Healds who died, by Hoyland, shows Thomasin Heald died Jan 21, 1703, that he was of Mobberley and was buried in Mobberley. RG6 Quaker Burial Records show Thomas Healds died and were buried in Quaker Burial Grounds, Mobberley, Jan 16, 1703, Jan 23, 1699, Dec 1686. A Thomasen Heald was buried 23 March 1703/4.

Some insert another Thomas Heald between this Thomas and William. They say he was born December 6, 1601 and that parents were married same year. They say he died June, 1645. His wife is said to have been Elizabeth??

The Dr. Pusey Heald files speculate that Thomas was the son of William Heald, gentleman and member of the established Anglican church. This William married in 1615. Thomas may have been disowned for becoming a Friend.

Debye@aol.com shows Thomas born April 1622 in Mobberley, died Nov 23, 1699, per Hollingsworth Register, vol 9, #2. He is buried in Mobberley Burial Ground, Cheshire, Eng.

Others says Thomas died 2-26-1735/36.

# GENEALOGY IN PRINT - BOOKS AND LIBRARY COLLECTIONS

Note from The Ancestors and Descendants of Henry Patrick and Mary Sansom Heald, DE Historical Society: "Nothing more is known of this couple except there is a record of this family in the Minutes of Mobberly Monthly Meeting. Since William and Jane Heald died within a few days of each other, some ravishing disease or epidemic may have claimed them. It is not known who reared their minor children."

(Lyford Hale note: See note for Sam I; it appears that the Lindsay family took them in.)

William's father, Thomas, was still living in Mobberley when William died, according to Deaths of Healds list by Hoyland.

A book of PA birth records shows their son, Samuel, being born in Chester Co. PA, in 1668, which is 34 years before the writers of the Jacob and Martha book believe they were in America. Every other Heald record shows Samuel and Mary Bancroft being born in England. Only the book of abstracts shows them born in the U.S. The book of abstracts must be incorrect.

From the Dr. Pusey Heald collection, Delaware Historical Society, two typewritten pages of information from letters by a Heald researcher who went to England, then reported his findings to Dr. Heald:

"So far as we can trace the Heald line with certainty, they were Protestants in the true sense of the word, for they protested against an established church, whether Roman or Anglican. They were members of the Society of Friends, or, as commonly known, Quakers, being members of that body almost from its inception.

"The immigrant ancestor, Samuel Heald and his wife Mary (Bancroft), came to America in 1703 from Cheshire (or Chester County) England, and settled in Chester County, Pa., about twenty years after the first Quaker exodus to Pennsylvania.

"The preservation of many of the Heald records is due to the faithfulness with which, since about 1650, the Society of Friends has kept records of births, marriages and burials of its membership. When records have been wanting, it has been because some members of the family departed from the discipline of the Society.

"In the records preserved at the Yearly Meeting, London (Devonshire House, Bishopsgate, E.C.), beginning about 1650, and continuing until 1703, the following Healds of Mobberley are found ... (see photocopied record for list, which is also incorporated in this genealogy)."

From Bi-Centennial of Old Kennett Meeting House, 1710-1910, in Salisbury, NC, public library: "Samuel Heald, Son of William and Jane (Dunbabin) Heald, was born 9-12-1668, in Mobberley, in Cheshire, England and married Mary Bancroft, born at Eccleston, in the same county, 5-13-1673; daughter of John and Mary Bancroft. They brought a certificate to Philadelphia from the monthly meeting at Morley, in Cheshire, dated 10-3-1702. They settled in what is now Pennsbury Township, on the Brandywine, Chester Co., PA, where Samuel died in 1736. They had eight children (which are named [other records show 10 children-LH])."

Bancroft is not named in Bi-Centennial of Old Kennett nor is Samuel Jr.

# From the Jacob and Martha Harvey Hale book:

"Yeoman, Friend. The family came to America in 1703, bringing with them a certificate from "Monthly Meeting held at Morley, Co. of Chester, England to Friends in Philadelphia," bearing the date of 10-2-1702. In this certificate it is noted that they 'were born of believing parents.' The Healds settled on the Brandywine in what is now Pennsbury Tp, Chester Co, PA. They lived there until death. Both Samuel and Jane are buried in 'Old Kennet' Burial Ground." (Lyford & his wife visited Kennett Oct. 1999. Went inside the MM House and walked the cemetery. The older grave markers are gone. The earliest were stones with initials on them. They did not find the graves of Samuel or Jane.)

JV Hollingsworth Library Collection: John Heald, brother of Sam I, Valentine Hollingsworth and Sam I lived close to each other. Both Sam and John were members of Kennett MM. John was the most active.

Microfilm file of Kennett Square MM for 1747 and 1748 shows the leaders attempting to deal with Samuel Heald, who they said was "drinking to excess" and not attending meetings. After several requests that Sam come answer to the Meeting, which were not answered, in 1748 he was disowned. He died the same year, so it does not appear that he reconciled. It also appears that the next two Sams were not in the Quaker church. Sam III was married in Old Swedes Church. The marriage record for Sam IV has not been located. Sam IV's son, Harlen, was not a Quaker at the time of his marriage, but was received by the Back Creek MM meeting 10 years after his marriage.

Wills of Chester Co, PA 1748-1766, page 5, shows that when Samuel Heald died, his wife, Rachel, was appointed administrator. This was done on 5-16-1748.

John d in his 78th year; both were buried at old Kennett, without doubt." John Heald's will, made 4th mo. 29, 1791, proved 3d mo. 18, 1800. Witnesses John Craig, Valentine Hollingsworth, and son Isaac, executor. It gives "all my farm, where I now dwell, of 191 acres, to son Isaac, together with all my other estate whatsoever." He is to pay to each of "my daughters, to wit, Sarah McFarlan, Lydia Morrow and Hannah Howell, the sum of 25 pounds current silver money, in two equal

payments -- 12 pounds 10 shillings in one year, and the other 12 pounds 10 shillings in 2 1/2 years after my decease." The will names Sarah first, and she was likely the eldest. Only three daughters are named in the will: we have evidence of four. Fourth is named as Polly, who probably died before 1791.

"It is an oft-told Hales of Ohio story that a brother of Jacob moved to Georgia and developed the Georgia peach. Edward J. Hale and family moved to NY after the war and became publishers. Samuel (III) was not a member of the Friends when married, since Kennett Monthly Meeting of Friend recorded: "Ruth Harlan was complained of for her marriage by a priest to one not in unity with the Friends." and Ruth was disowned 4-16-1761. Samuel was a merchant and interested in water commerce. He had several sloops in Wilmington, Del with which to carry on his business. Not leaving a will at his death, his wife, Ruth, was granted 'Letters of Administration for his estate in Chester Co, PA, 6-19-1772.' To this she signed her name 'Ruth Heald.' Her sureties were Thomas Carleton and Joseph Harlan, probably her father. An inventory of the estate was signed 'East Caln, October 1783. Errors accepted by Ruth Langley.' The name of a sixth child was not found."

Sam III was about 8 when his father died. I've found no record that his mom remarried.

Samuel was buried in Friends Burying Grounds, Kennett Township, Chester Co, PA A person did not have to be a Friend to be buried in their cemetery.

I was born in Loudoun County, Virginia, on the 10th day of the First Month, 1766, at the foot of a mountain called "Short Hill", a spur which puts out of Blue Mountains at Harper's Ferry, where a small stream and a great road pass through it. A village is located on the east side, called the Gap, near which I was born.

In the year 1771 my father moved his family over the mountains to a place now called Uniontown, where Henry Beeson was building a mill, and had a field cleared which father got to plant in corn. The next year he removed 11 west, where he had three tracts of land on one of which he stayed two years. When the Indian War broke out, after he had planted his corn, he decided to take his family back over the mountains and after burying his iron tools, hardware and crockery ware, started but before he got to where Uniontown is now, where they were building a fort, he broke his wagon and was obliged to leave it and stop at the fort, where we stayed all summer, and went back to his farm twice and stayed two or three days each time to tend his corn. At one time he took my older brother and me with him, and while we were there the Indians killed a family about 3 miles from us on the Monongahela, but the Indians never attacked the fort. Two years after the Revolutionary War commenced, when he sold his land and removed to what is now Washington County, six miles west of Brownsville, and lived there in danger of the Indians. In the year 1799 he bought 40 acres of land with a mill site on it at the mouth of the Little Beaver and moved to it. I having been married in the year 1792 moved with him, and we built a grist mill and a saw mill.

In Tenth Month, 1801, I moved my family to now what is called Columbiana County, Ohio, having sold our mills for \$2700. I think in 1803 our County was organized, and the first court was held in Matthias Lower's barn; the jury sat on logs. The court had the appointing of County Surveyor, and at that court I was appointed to that office, and was reappointed at different times for 27 years. In the year 1805 I was appointed surveyor to divide 12 townships into sections and set corners to quarter sections. The townships had been laid out before and divided into lots of four sections each, so I had to run three lines through each township, both east and west and north and south and set quarter-section corners. My district was the 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th ranges adjoining the New Connecticut, or Western Reserve Line. I began early in the spring, and after I performed the work in the woods, I had to make three plats and descriptions of every township, one to be sent to Washington and one for the land office in Steubenville, and one for the General Surveyor who kept his office in Cincinnati, where I had to go to make my returns.

I was allowed \$3.00 a mile for surveying, having to find hands and diet. My fees were \$1300. and my outlay \$300. In the year 1840 my wife died. We had nine children. One died when he was seven years old, all the rest have families. I have had from that time to the present to live with my children. Am now living with my son-in-law, Albert F. Sharpless and his wife, my youngest daughter Lydia. When I arrived at my hundredth year, all my children living, and a number of their children, grandchildren and two of the fifth generation assembled with us. When we had dinner for them some of them made a calculation, and made out that my children, grand-children and great grand-children and two of the fifth generation, amount to 160 living.

I voted for Washington when a candidate for President, and voted at most of the presidential elections up to the present time.

General Index to Real Estate Conveyances, Etc., Randolph Co, shows several Joseph Hale land transactions, plus others for other Hales.

Randolph Co, NC Genealogical Journal, Fall 1994, p38, lists abstracts of settlements with guardians:

"Page 41 Dann Merrell & Solomon K. Goodman, guardian of the children of Joseph Hale, deceased. Mentions Samuel (Hale), Patsy Hale."

The above probably took place in the 1814 term.

On page 39, for the 1815 term: "Dan Merrell & Solomon K. Goodman, guardians for John, Patsy, Samuel, Ellice, Edward, Gromphrey (Phromphrey) Cintha and Betsy Hail, heirs of Joseph Hail, deceased."

On page 40, citation for page 52 of records: Dan Merrell & Solomon K Goodman, guardians of the heirs of Joseph Hale: "John, Patsy, Samuel, Ellis, Edward, James, Pomphrie, Herrindon, Cinthy & Betsy Hale. Mentions: 'paid Robert Parker his wife Patsy's legacy." (Note: Where did James and Herrindon come from??? This is first mention I've found of them. Herrindon probably misspelling of Harrendon, the maiden name of the mother of these children.)

1819 session, page 44 of journal, page 87 of court records: "Hale, deceased, heirs: Samuel Hale, Ellis Hale, Edward J. Hale, Pomfret Hale, Cintha Hale & Elizabeth Hale. Robert Parker mentioned." (Note: Who is Elizabeth? Is this Betsy?)

1823 term, page 4, Spring 1995 Journal, page 110 of court record: "Dan Merrill & John H. Hale, guardian of the heirs of Joseph Hale:

Ellis H. Hale, Edward James Hale, Pomprett H. Hale, Cynthia Hale & Elizabeth Hale." (Note: It looks like John H. Hale is the brother, who has reached an age to help the family.)

1824 term, page 6 of Spring 1995 journal lists "Cynthia Tomlinson, Pomphrete H. Hale, Elizabeth Hale."

Randolph County State Archives show an 1827 petition: "John Hale, Samuel Hale, Ellis Hale, Pomphry Hale, Edward Hale. John Hale guardian of Elizabeth Hale." Joseph Hale departed life owning several large tracts of land on the waters of the Uhwarrie. Joseph died intestate, leaving the said John, Samuel, Ellis, Pomphrey, Joseph, Elizabeth, William and Cynthia Hale the land.

Its also my desire that Betsy Merril Shall take my youngest Daughter Betsey Hale.

Its allso my desire that my beloved Sister Jane Burnatt shall have the raising of my Daughter Patsy Hale.

#### GENEALOGY IN PRINT - BOOKS AND LIBRARY COLLECTIONS

There is a Heald letter that gives the names of Sam III's children; so says the Jacob and Martha Harvey Hale book, page 203:

"Armonia Hale, son of Jacob and Martha, received a letter about 1850 from Edward J. Heald, his cousin and the son of Joseph Hale. Edward was publisher of the Fayetteville, NC, Observer. He wrote that his aunt, Mary Heald, had married John Harper and moved south. His uncle, Samuel Heald, owned large tracts of land in NC and had a son, Joseph, who went to Indiana. Armonia said about the time of the Civil War all contact was lost with the NC Heald/Hales."

#### MISC NOTES / QUESTIONS/ FOLLOWUP

The name may have been pronounced "Haild," not "Heeald". That would explain the transition to Hale, via phonetic spelling that was also spelled Hail at times.

Was Samuel's middle initial "H"? I have a note that says so, but don't know where it came from.

Here is evidence of Harlen's being the son of Samuel IV: As oldest son, or oldest living son (Joseph was dead already), Harlen was appointed administrator of his father's estate. The 1833 court records regarding Harlen's serving as administrator lists the names of his siblings and says they are "heirs of Samuel Hale, deceased."

When Sam was 2 or 3 his father died and his mother remarried. When he was about 15, the family moved to Cumberland Co., NC.

Look for info about Allen and Ruth Harlan Heald Langley, in NC. (Fayetteville is in Cumberland Co)

His brother Jacob married in Cane Creek, NC, in 1786.

1790 Census of Delaware, Christiana Hundred, lists Sam and Jacob Heald. Sam's brother is in Randolph Co by this time, as are Allen and Ruth Heald Langely (See 1790 Fed census for North Carolina). This may be a cousin or uncle.

Sam IV may have married in Delaware and had land there. The Mill Creek Hundred, Delaware, 1790 Census also lists Sam Heald, but the Dr. Pusey Heald files show this Samuel to be a

cousin. This Jacob may be the one buried at Old Swedes Church. Need to sort out the Mill Creek and Christiana Hundred Sam Healds.

Did his son, Joseph, move to Indiana prior to 1850? Did he go to Georgia or did his brother, Joseph?

From land transactions upon the death of Mary Hale, it appears that she had additional sisters who are not on my list: Nancy who married Joshua Pool; Ruth who married James Davis; Sarah who married Nathan Kendal or Kendall and had children: Addison and Cynthia. Or is this wrong Mary???

Interestingly, listed next to her on the census sheet, which I believe means he was her neighbor, is Phineas Henley, son of John and Keziah Henley. Background note:

Mary Jane Hale grew up in Lewistown, Pennsylvania, with her mother, Jane M. Hale, and two bothers, Reuben and Elias, who suffered from consumption. She probably had additional siblings. Mary Jane married Gideon Welles on June 16, 1835, and they had at least three children: Anna Jane, Tom, and Edgar. At the time these letters were written, the Welles family lived on H street, between 9th and 10th, in Washington, D.C., and Gideon was Chief of the Bureau of Provisions and Clothing for the Navy. He would go on to serve as Lincoln's and then Johnson's Secretary of the Navy.

#### Scope and contents:

These six letters from Mary Jane Hale to her mother primarily discuss her children's illnesses and exploits, and her social life in Washington D. C. She also solicited her mother for news about her brothers and friends from home. Her letters do not flow particularly well, and she rarely described anything in detail, probably because she was often writing from the midst of her family, with a "great noise" and "so much confusion" all around her.

Although she often mentioned charitable work, Mary Jane did not appear to take an active part in organizing either church benefits or the work at the nearby Female Orphan Society. She did apply to adopt a girl in 1847, but when the first applicants

were refused, the Asylum managers thought it better not to place the girl at all, in order not to further offend the rejected applicants. Even with the help of a couple young women, caring for her family occupied her time entirely. When she could, she strolled on the grounds of the Capitol, and once went to hear John C. Calhoun speak, "though I scare know how to take the time" ([1848 May 15]).

Mary Jane's most extended description was of the May Ball put on by her daughter's dancing school, which had been going on in D. C. "from time immemorial almost" (1848 May 5). She detailed the roles the girls played, the dresses, the flowers, and the procession. Mary Jane also wrote a sustained description of the cameo she had carved in her husband's likeness, which "looks as if it might speak. it is actually a better likeness than anything I ever saw. only think how valuable!" (1847 May 7).

She always referred to her husband as "Mr. Welles," and although little of his character comes through, they appear to have had a happy relationship. She told her mother that when she sprained her foot, her husband "insisted upon carrying me down to my meals, which I think was very unnecessary, but he made believe the victuals tasted better with me in sight," (1848 January 12). She also noted that Mr. Welles "would much rather see me reading" than doing fancy work.

However, Jacob and his family were in good standing with the Friends because on 10-7-1809 they were granted a certificate from Cane Creek MM (NC) to Center MM, Clinton. They were received in OH 9-1-1810.

When the Northwest Territory opened up, Jacob and his brothers-in-law, John Hadley and Isaac Harvey -- and other relatives -- moved. See the book for more details. Jacob, John and Isaac scouted where to live in 1805. In 1807, about 200 friends and family moved. The Hales settled on Todd's Fork, Clinton Co. Believe this is now Adams Township. They were active in the Center MM. Much more info in the book.

Jacob was one of the earliest settlers to Todds Fork (a branch of the Little Miami River) Highland Co., Ohio. In 1805, accompanied by John Hadley and Isaac Harvey (both brothers-in-law) he came to view the country. They traveled on horseback, coming through Highland Co., OH. They found it a "goodly land." They returned to NC, resolved to part with their possessions there, and removed with their families to OH as soon as possible. Jacob was largely engaged in business in NC, and owned considerable land. They selected a tract of land on Todd's Fork, then owned by Robert Pollard of VA, as suitable for homes. The tract of land contained over 2000 acres and was purchased by Isaac Harvey and his brother Eli. In 1806/07, Jacob and family settled in Clinton Co, in what is now Adams Township.

It is for the Cane Creek Monthly Meeting, NC. Shows Jacob's wife was Martha, and a daughter Elizabeth, also received same date.) Samuel Hale died (intestate) in Randolph Co., NC in Sept or Oct 1829. The court appointed Harlen B. Hale as administrator of estate. Estate was inventoried on 17 Nov 1829 and sold shortly thereafter. Jane Hale, bought almost all the household furniture. Priscilla Hale bought 1 heifer and a chest. In Nov 1829, Jane (or Jeanne, hard to read) widow petitioned court for support from estate. (Ref: Estate Records, Randolph Co., NC C.R. 081-508-60). Hopes this helps. I don't have any connection yet of Jacob and Samuel with my line which begins with Edward Hale in Isle of Wight Co., VA ca 1650. Forrest Hale

This, however, is merely an inference drawn from the dictionary definition of the word. In calling it a place name, I have followed what I have thought to be the better authorities. Hales is a variant of Hale. Some English writers have maintained that the s is frequently added to monosyllabic names for no apparent reason whatever. My own opinion in this matter I have given under the story of the monosyllabic place-name of street."

There were Hales (with the s) among early settlers of Somerset county, on the Eastern Shore, and there was a Quaker family of the same way of spelling the name, in New Castle county, Delaware, early in the 18th century. John Hales was sent to represent the George's Creek meeting to the Duck Creek meeting, 22nd 5th month 1706.

"I Harlin B. Hale of the County of Randolph and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following to say first that my executrix (herein after named) shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all my funeral expenses. Together with my (last?) debts whosoever and to whomsoever owing out of the monies that may first come into her hands as a part or parcel of my estate ---- Item, I give and devise to my beloved wife Sarah, all my crop, stock, and provisions on hand, and all my lands. This to be a legacy to her so long as she remains my widdow. To be disposed of by her and to divide amongest my children as she may think best with the advice of her friends, and she shall have power to dispose of at public or private sale any property that she may wish for the purpose of educating my children. --

Item. My silver watch, all my household and kitchen furniture I give to my wife for the use of her self and children, all my farming tools I give to my wife for her proper use and benefit, and I further authorize my wife to collect all my outstanding debts. \_\_\_\_ me. For her use and disposition. And lastly I do hereby constitute and apppoint my beloved wife Sarah Executrix of this my last will and testament. In testimony I have here unto affixed my hand and seal this 7th day of January A.D. 1853. Signed sealed and published and declared in the presence of John Craven and Nixon Henley."

Signed Harlen B Hale.

On back side of the will is this: "North Carolina Court of Pleas and Quarter \_\_\_\_\_ Randolph County August Term 1853

"This last will and testament of Harlen B Hale deceased, is produced in open Court and the due execution thereof being found by John A Craven and Nixon Henley, the sub\_\_\_\_ witnesses thereto, said will is admitted to probate and ordered to be recorded. B. T? Hoover, Clerk."

## MISC NOTES / QUESTIONS/ FOLLOWUP

Harlen was about 30 when his father died. He became a Quaker -- or at least was received by Back Creek MM -- 10 years after his marriage.

Harlen's headstone is in Back Creek Cemetery, across the street from the Back Creek Meeting House (Pastor is Ray Lambe, as of 1998). Headstone reads: "Harlen B. Hale, 6th of 5th mo 1853. Aged 54 years 1 mo & 2 days." This viewed by LH on 9-23-98. Harlen's grave is about 14 feet directly left of large headstone of Dr. Barney Nixon. Back Creek is about three miles west of Asheboro, just a block off Highway 64.

That she was well acquainted with this said Sarah Hale from the year A.D. 1802 until the date of her death as aforesaid that the said Sarah Hale was the daughter of one John Henly, a Half Breed Cherokee Indian who it is said was born on the Cherokee Indian reservation East of Mississippi River in the year A.D. 1767 and died in Randolph County and State of North Carolina in the year A.D. 1842. That she was well acquainted with the said John Henly in his life time from the year A.D. 1802 until the date of death of the said John Henly as aforesaid that the said John Henly was a son of one Sarah Henly whose maiden name was Sarah Elmore a Cherokee Indian woman who it is said was born on the Cherokee Indian Reservation East of the Mississippi River and died in Randolph County and State of North Carolina in the year A.D. 1813. That she was well acquainted with the said Sarah Henly in her life time from the year AD 1802 until the date of her death as aforesaid that she knows that the said Sarah Henly was a Cherokee Indian woman and a recognized member of the Cherokee tribe of Indians in her life time that she was well

acquainted with one Mary Winslow in her life time that the said Mary Winslow was a person of Cherokee Indian descent and was born in Randolph County and State of North Carolina on the 26th Day of January A.D. 1840 and died in Cleveland County and State of North Carolina on the 24th Day of March A.D. 1876 and was the daughter of the said Sarah Hale as aforesaid that the said Mary Winslow was a Sister to the said Jane McDaniel, Edward H. Hale and Samuel H. Hale as aforesaid witness.

(from LDS records, Synthia Scarlett, daughter of Stephen and Sally, born in Orange Co, NC about 1799- could this person be related to woman in above records? Was Scarlett a married name?)

## Notes for CARLTON H. SCHURDELEAU:

History of Pottery in the South, by Ida Maye Shuffler, Heritage & Sons, 1942: "Carlton H. Schurdeleau was one of the first and best known of the early pottery makers in Seagrove, North Carolina. He is credited with inventing a special firing process known only in that area. It involves the use of printed reports from the State legislature, which Mr. Schurdeleau claimed burned at a much higher temperature than ordinary paper due to a high content of "bullpucky" (a technical term familiar to kiln operators). The use of this paper resulted in an unusual effect which is not duplicated elsewhere."

Oral tradition in the family says the Schurdeleau's first family member came to America about the time of the Jamestown unhappiness, which would be early 1600's, but details are not available. Carlton would not discuss his parents, saying only that they most definitely were Swiss, not French.

# Notes for CARLTON H. SCHURDELEAU, JR.:

Carlton Jr was a writer of dime novels. His writing career began at the age of nine, when he penned an autobiographical short story entitled, "Maw, Beth Sally Pinched Me!" Ten years later his first book appeared, a thriller based on his knowledge of pottery making. It was set in his home town of Seagrove, North Carolina. The title was "Who broke the pot, Nimo?" It didn't do well, but subsequent books did much better. "Pigeon on a Hot Tin Roof" was a best seller in his day, as was "A Horsecart Named Desire." After moving away from North Carolina, seeking independence from his family, he dropped his first name and chose to be known as Tennessee Schurdeleau. We know him today by his full name: Carlton "Tennessee" Schurdeleau. In Santa Clara California, his home for several years during the middle years of his life, is marked by a historic plaque that honors this gifted literary talent.

ELI HALE, deceased, late of Vernon Township, was one of the most prominent farmers of this county at an early day in its history. He was born in North Carolina in 1798. His father was Jacob Hale, also a native of North Carolina, and a planter. His mother was Elizabeth Harvey. They came to Ohio at a very early day, locating on Todd's Fork, in Chester Township, when the subject of this sketch was but six or seven years of age. They resided there till their deaths, the former occurring in 1845, and the latter in 1858. The old homestead farm is now owned by Armonia Hale. Eli Hale grew up on the old home farm, and when a young man engaged to clerk for his brother, Samuel Hale, at Washington C. H. He subsequently engaged in mercantile pursuits at Clarksville, Vernon Township, dealing in produce and rafting it down to New Orleans, where it was traded for goods. He also dealt largely in pork and flour. About 1825, he married Anna, daughter of William Hadley, of this county. After marriage, he commenced dealing in real estate, at one time owning about 3,800 acres of land in Vernon Township. As fast as he accumulated means, he invested in real estate, and subsequently lost almost his entire fortune. At one time, Eli Hale was considered only second in wealth to any one in Clinton County. Himself and John Hadley were two of the leading and enterprising spirits of southwestern Clinton, and Mr. Hale was always largely interested in all matters pertaining to the development and growth of Clinton County. He was an Orthodox Friend by birth, and politically a member of the Whig party. He departed this life in 1849, and is interred in the Quaker Burying Ground at Clarksville. Eight children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Hale, five now living -Melinda (wife of Henry Sherwood, of Waynesville, Warren Co., Ohio), William H. (from whom these facts were obtained, residing at Richmond, Ind.), Miles M. (of Topeka, Kan.), Sarah A. (wife of David Pritchard, of Knightstown, Ind.), and Alfred (also residing at Topeka, Kan.). Mrs. Hale is living with her daughter at Waynesville, Ohio. and is in the seventy-third year of her age.

GENERAL M. W. RANSOM'S BRIGADE. 1910 BRADY, THE PRINTER STATESVILLE, N. C.

April 24th, Company's I, E and G, all under my command, were ordered to Gum Swamp, ten miles east of Kinston. On the 28th we were attacked by four regiments, at least 1600 men, while my force was 165. We held our position on the east side of the swamp for about two hours, then crossed to the west side and fought until darkness closed the battle. We lost one officer, Lieutenant Lutterloh, and three men killed. Enemy's loss, ten killed and eighteen wounded. Next morning Adjutant E. J. Hale wrote an account of the skirmish and published it in the Fayetteville Observer. He says, "Capt. Harrill, Company I, commanded during the first of the fight and until the arrival of Colonel Faison. He is certainly one of the coolest men I ever saw, and all award him praise for the admirable handling of his little force while in command. \* \* \* \*. Our officers and men behaved most admirably, not one leaving his post or straggling in any way \* \* \* \* \*. The force of the enemy in our front consisted of six regiments of infantry and a squadron of cavalry." (For another account see North Carolina Regiments, Vol. III, page 323.)

Hubert Sanders letter to Areatha Hale Wildman has some family background info. LH has a copy of the letter. It says, in part, that:

The Branson Sanders family moved to Kansas in 1868. The Hale and Sanders families moved to Indiana in 1874. Then to Arkansas, then to Bluejacket in the Northeastern part of Oklahoma.

Edward worked on the Indiana farm of John and Rachel Wildman, Uncle Erwin's parents. The first mention of this is in the Wildman's ledgeer dated 1875. Edward worked on the Wildman farm and was a carpenter during the time the family was living near the Wildman farm in Wabash.

Family moved from Ind. to Ark in 1881 or 1882, staying for about two years. Mary Jane was about 1 1/2 years old when they moved to Cherokee County, Kansas, staying about three years.

In the late 1890's Ed Hale and the older boys went to New Salem in central Oklahoma. They built a house. When finished, Sarah and the other children traveled by train to New Salem. See the certificate of removal above.

## From a brother or sister of Sam Hale:

"Don't know just when Father began to try to prove info on his claim (Cherokee) but it was because of that prospect that we moved to Bluejacket and that was long before March 7, 1907. In fact, we moved there some time in Nov, I think, and you were born in Feb.; I have just called Beulah to know what she may remember about it, but didn't get any answer."

#### MISC NOTES / QUESTIONS/ FOLLOWUP

The 1907 lawsuit listed people who believed they were owed money that was promised to Cherokees by the government. The list included John and Anna Henley and Edward Hale, born High Point NC 1-11-1838. This is from the Muskogee Area Office, Muskogee, Ok. 1962. The birthday corresponds to our Edward Henley Hale, but I don't know about John and Anna Henley. This is not proof of Indian heritage, only proof that the relatives believed they were part Cherokee.
